Town News ... From the Desk of Town Supervisor Ernest Haywood...

The total Solar eclipse is just around the corner on Monday, April 8. Although the town itself is not hosting any activities, we encourage you to take advantage of this once in a lifetime event by visiting the Genesee County Chamber of Commerce website at GeneSeeTheEclipse.com. The Genesee County Park is offering a variety of activities that day. Traffic is expected to be heavy along Route 19 on April 8 so be sure to give yourself extra time if traveling.

We have submitted another grant application in pursuit of funding for restrooms at Robins Brook Park. The Town has set aside ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funds and our highway department is willing and able to help with the site work for the project if we can achieve a matching funding source.

Mengel, Metgar and Barr, CPAs completed the 2022 Federal Single Audit and presented it to the Town Board on February 13. The Federal Single Audit is a requirement whenever a municipality receives more than \$750,000 in federal funding in one year. Bergen WIBA1 water project received more than \$750,000 in both 2022 and 2023 so we will have to repeat the Federal Single Audit proce for 2023. That work is just beginning now.

Additionally, the State Comptroller began an audit here in September 2023, as part of their periodic audits of all Towns and Village Field work was completed on site in January. We have not yet received the Comptroller's audit report. When we do, it will be share with the public.

We have been working on updating our cyber security policy. This is an important undertaking and one required by our insurance carrier.

Our new town clerk, town board members and I participated in training provided by the Association of Towns. It was very helpful training as the complexities of even small governments has grown.

It has been a relatively mild Winter and Spring will be upon us before we know it. The County continues to make great progress on many of our major projects. The Jail we are constructing is coming along nicely with substantial completion to be the end of March or early April. Inmates do not move until June as the transition team and staff works to prepare the facility and move in prior to the in-mates arrival. The project continues to be on time and despite a few typical change orders, the project remains well within our budget. To date this has been a very well run and successful construction project. The County has also decided to outfit the backup 911 center in the jail while the contractors were on site. This move saves about 20% of the cost of that project that we had planned to do in the next 12-18 months anyway as we decommission the old jail and backup 911 center.


We are excited to announce that we have a signed contract with Spectrum to start construction this Summer on all the remaining address points of unserved customers across the County. As far as we know, we are the only County in New York State that we will be able to make the claim that we will be able to give every address point in the County an opportunity to connect to broadband.

We are looking to wrap up phase 2 of the water infrastructure project this Fall that included many pump station improvements and water line upsizing. There has been an incredible amount of time and effort that has been put into efforts to obtain outside dollars from elected officials in the State and Federal level to put towards phase 3 of our water project. Our Chair recently met with officials in Washington DC attempting to secure significant funding from the Army Corp that is earmarked for our water project. This will be game changing funding towards our \$150 million project to secure the County with water needs for today and the future.

We have a contract with Mercy Flight to support their ambulance service throughout the County. EMS service is under incredible pressure throughout Up State NY for coverage as these service providers continue to struggle with costs and labor supply. We are fortunate to have this provider in our County and look to strengthen and support them with a contractual relationship so they can continue full coverage for critical services. We also continue to look at our fire services and opportunities to promote and help volunteer services including possible property tax exemptions.

Genesee County is very excited to be in the direct path of totality for the 2024 Solar eclipse. There is advanced planning for this once in a lifetime event on April 8, 2024. There is planning for our community to see potentially tens to hundreds of thousands of additional people that day in our County. See http://geneseetheeclipse.com/. I think my feeling is shared by many when I say we seemed to have dodged a harsh winter. Old Punxutawney Phil predicted an early spring, and we are finding this out to be true. The bad side to this is the mild early spring temperatures are making it difficult for collecting sap to make maple syrup. We need freezing night time temperatures and mild daytime temperatures for the sap to flow. Genealogist, Jodi Fisher and myself are patiently waiting for this to happen so we can embark on the third season of our North Bergen Maple Syrup History Project where we have re-created the life and times of Calvin Dean, maple syrup producer in 1915 North Bergen.

As 2024 starts underway, I am looking forward to what will hope to be another prosperous year for the Harford Museum. I am excited to say, I can hardly wait to break the museum out of mothballs, clear the cobwebs, and bust open the doors for the 2024 season.
